CERT Runs Successful Drill this June

On June 12 CERT held a drill practicing an initial damage assessment survey. This would be the first step after an earthquake or other widespread disaster. The purpose is to find out what kinds of damage and how extensive that damage is and report it to the city office of emergency services. We sent teams to each part of the neighborhood and used a visual cue-to-incident table (for example, a red car in the drive way meant a fire) to simulate damage. The incidents were called in to a radio operator at the trailer and compiled on the standard form used for reporting to the city.

The drill went well, and everyone got practice in good radio procedures. We managed to survey nearly the entire neighborhood in under two hours using a combination of teams walking, riding bicycles, and driving. We learned several lessons that will be incorporated into future training.

July marked our first in-person meeting in over a year. We also had a Zoom meeting in parallel. Future meetings will be in-person, and we will maintain the Zoom meetings while we have members who are not comfortable meeting in-person.

CERT is always ready to welcome new volunteers to participate with us. If you are interested you can contact Tim Slattery at CERT@montaloma.org. The City normally runs CERT training classes four times a year, but those classes are currently suspended due to the pandemic.



New Narrow Streets Ordinance Update

Enforcement of the ordinance prohibiting oversize vehicles from parking on our neighborhood streets will begin after all the signs are installed. There is no provision for short-term visitors, but one city council member believes that the police officers will enforce it as they do for overtime parking: Only following a complaint, and after giving several days notice before issuing a ticket. But the council member stressed that this is only an opinion.

The City Attorney is quite clear that there is no exemption in the ordinance for short-term visitors, and that it cannot be modified sooner than one year after adoption.

HELPFUL HINTS FROM THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Keeping Monta Loma Clean and Green

Water Conservation:

- California has hit a mega-drought year due to exceedingly low rainfall over the last year.
- Do your part to save water by checking your sprinklers.

Street sweeping has resumed!

- Help the sweeper clean your gutter by moving your vehicles and trash bins off the street the evening before the second and fourth Thursdays of each month. Cars should be moved by 6:00 a.m.
- The next street sweeping dates are: 9/9, 9/23, 10/14, 10/28 and 11/11.
- If you have tenants who park on the street, please keep them informed of dates as well. www.mountainview.gov/ depts/pw/transport/schedule.asp

NEW Recycling of Old Clothes: Place clothing and textiles in a secured, clear plastic bag marked for donation on the ground next to carts on your regular collection day. Clothing and textiles do need to be clean (as in washed) prior to placing curbside. Shoes of all kinds (even singles) are accepted if placed in a clear bag separate from clothing and textiles.

What goes in which bin: Visit mvrecycle.org

Hide those bins: Remove carts from the street the evening after garbage collection or no later than the next day. Store the carts inside the garage or screened from street view as a courtesy to your neighbors. If these areas are unavailable, place the carts on the side of the garage or house.

Walkable Sidewalks:

- Please keep weeds under control, especially those nasty foxtails that get into our pets' toes, ears, and noses. Sweep sidewalks after mowing weeds.
- Please trim shrubs back to the full width of the sidewalk and to a height of seven feet, as recommended by the city.
- Keep sidewalks clear of debris, especially after rain, for the safety of pedestrians.

Dogs:

- In addition to always picking up dog droppings from others' yards, always pick up dog messes deposited at the Monta Loma Park fields. Dogs are not allowed on fields when school is in session, including during summer.
- Please don't deposit doggie bags in neighbors' trash cans after they've been emptied.
- Incontinent dogs should be walked in the gutter, not on sidewalks.

Check Your Car's Air Filters

Last summer, along with the pandemic, we dealt with terrible fires. We had masks to prevent breathing the smoke...and we tried to get home air filtration systems. But did you know your car was protecting you too?



Our cars have two filters: one to filter the air that goes into the engine and one to filter the air that comes into the cabin

to filter the air that comes into the cabin through the vents. The cabin air filter can get especially dirty and impacted with leaves and debris because of its location, under the dash, where all the leaves accumulate at the base of the windshield. Nearly every cabin air filter we have inspected needs replacing because of the fires. They are black with soot.

In general, it takes a little time to replace them; often the glove box needs to be removed, but it is something a handy person can do. And the engine's air filter is generally easy to change and should be checked and changed as well. To see if it needs replacing, even if it doesn't look dirty, try shining a flashlight through it to see how much light gets through.

Last year, some asked about HEPA filters for the cars. They do exist, but they can make the blower motor work really hard to push the air through the denser filter, putting strain on the blower motor, with is the same problem as driving around with an impacted cabin air filter.

Our shop manuals recommend changing cabin and engine air filters every 15,000-30,000 miles, but if you live in a dusty area, have an extreme fire season or are sensitive to pollen, change it more frequently.
